# Exchange Course Selection

2 options available. You can either:

**Option 1:** select a program and follow the <u>courses as pre-assigned</u> in the program. No course substitution.

**Option 2:** select your courses "à la carte" meaning you can <u>select and mix</u> courses from different programs as long as scheduling allows it.

# **Double Degree Course Selection**

No course selection possible. Student follows the courses as assigned in the program in order to obtain degree. Student may be invited to select elective courses among a specific selection as defined by the program.

#### **Thesis**

**Academic Calendar** Master's in Engineering **Masters of Science**

Orientation New incoming student orientation is held about a week prior to the teaching starts.

> New incoming student must make sure to arrive on campus on time to attend orientation week. They will get to learn more about our campus, our teaching methods as well as other relevant information regarding their studies in France.

Exact dates will be confirmed later.

**Examination Period** Fall term: one week in January

Spring term: one week in June

Note: earlier or extra examinations for exchange students cannot be arranged at

TSP. Students need to attend exams at the official examination dates.

Dates may vary between program majors.

**Grading and credits** The grading scale is 0-20 (0 is the lowest and 20 is the highest, with 10 being the

lowest passing grade) or pass/fail.

**Semester Workload** 30 ECTS credits (= European Credit Transfer System)

1 ECTS per term is equivalent to 25-30 hours of studying. Telecom SudParis

expects partner students to study full-time and pass courses with good grades.

Language of

French and English. TSP offers more than 11 Master's programs fully in English. Instruction Preferred language of instruction must be confirmed during application process.

**FLE Courses** Complimentary weekly French language courses (FLE) are provided to

international students during the semester. Intensive French session is also

organized during late summer.

Note: To facilitate integration to France, FLE intensive program organized in

September is mandatory to all non-French speaking dual degree-seeking students.

Students can request a digitally signed transcript of records. Signed and stamped

paper version can be provided to the student on request.

# Nomination & Application

### **Step 1: Nomination**

The home institution must nominate the selected student(s) prior to the nomination deadline by using appropriate nomination form:

## **Step 2: Application**

The nominated student(s) <u>will be receiving an email notification containing the application link prior</u> to the application deadline. The following documents will need to be provided during the application process:

- Online Form/Application
- One-page letter of motivation/statement of purpose (either in French or English)
- Curriculum Vitae (either in French or English)
- Copy of valid passport or National ID
- A study plan of the courses (exchanges only)
- A recent passport style picture
- Transcript of records (Bachelor grades for M1 program; Bachelor & Master 1 grades for M2 program) (either in French or English)
- Language proficiency certificate based on the type of courses or program (can be issued by home institution)
- Recommendation letter(s) (optional)

**Application results** Application results will be ready usually within six weeks after the application

deadline.

Exchange Admission Requirements

Students must have validated at least 120 ECTS for L3 level courses, 180

ECTS for M1 level courses and 240 ECTS for M2 level courses.

Double-Degree Admission Requirements Masters of Science: students must have validated at least 120 ECTS for L3

program, 180 ECTS for M1 program and 240 ECTS for M2 program.

Master's in Engineering: students must have validated at least 180 ECTS for L3

program or 240 ECTS for M1 program.

Note: double-degree admission into M2 is not available.

Language Proficiency

Partner students need either an official language test certificate or a certificate from their home institution stating that the student has sufficient language skills to study in **English (min. B2 CEFR level)** or/and **French (min. B2 CEFR level)** in their selected program. For programs delivered in English, students whose mother tongue is English or who study in English-taught program in university are

exempted from providing a language certificate.

# Accommodation Evry campus

The main housing provider is "La Maisel", conveniently located just within walking distance to our campus.

Students must apply for housing themselves following the instructions provided by Telecom SudParis upon admission.

# Cost of Living in France

For your convenience, we have put together an estimated cost of living in France that should help you students unsure studying at Telecom SudParis is within their financial expectations.

## Visa Requirements

### **EU Students**

Citizens of EU members States, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway or Switzerland do not need a visa for France.

#### **Non-EU Students**

Non-European students must apply for long stay student visa (4 months to one year).

• "Etudes en France" procedure (Studying in France). Students coming from a country concerned by this process will have to create an online account from the website "Etudes en France".

# Financial requirement

For visa issuance, French authorities require financial guarantee of 615€ per month (7380€ for a year).

### **Health Insurance**

#### **EU Students**

Citizens of EU members States, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway or Switzerland are not required to enroll in the French National Healthcare IF they have a **European Health Insurance Card** (EHIC). The EHIC must be valid until the end of their stay. EHIC will allow students to get their healthcare expenses reimbursed under the same conditions as if they were in their home country. EHIC should be obtain prior to arrival in France. European students who do not hold an EHIC must apply for the French National Healthcare like other international students.

#### **Non-EU Students**

Enrollment to the French National Healthcare known as « *Sécurité Sociale* » is free and mandatory. This will allow students to benefit from partial refund on healthcare expenses, on average 60%. All the registration process is done online once visa is obtained.
